*Statistical Data Report for August 2022, Released October 2022*

### State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in August in 16 states and stable in 34 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. All 50 states and the District had jobless rate decreases from a year earlier. The national unemployment rate rose to 3.7 percent over the month but was 1.5 percentage points lower than in August 2021.

Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 10 states, decreased in 1 state, and was essentially unchanged in 39 states and the District of Columbia in August 2022. The largest job gains occurred in Kentucky (+26,700), New York (+25,600), and Virginia (+16,700). The largest percentage increases occurred in Alaska and Kentucky (+1.4 percent each), followed by Oregon and Washington (+0.5 percent each). Employment decreased in Mississippi.

# HOOSIERS BY THE NUMBERS

Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 40 states and the District of Columbia and was essentially unchanged in 4 states. The largest job increases occurred in Texas (+726,900), California (+677,100), and Florida (+443,600). The largest percentage increases occurred in Texas (+5.7 percent) and Nevada (+5.0 percent), followed by Florida, Georgia, and New Jersey (+4.9 percent each).

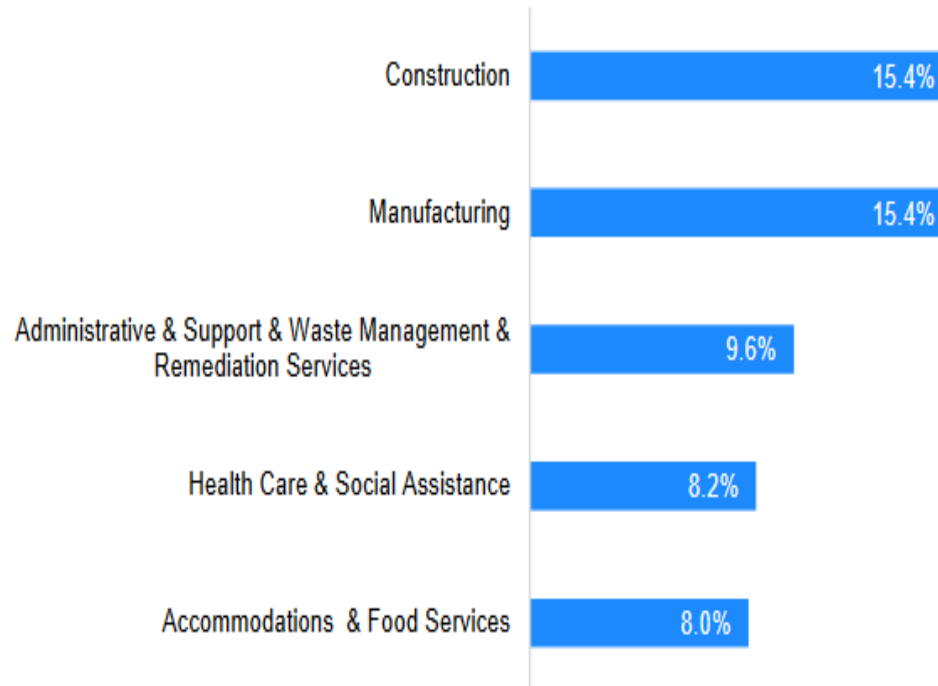

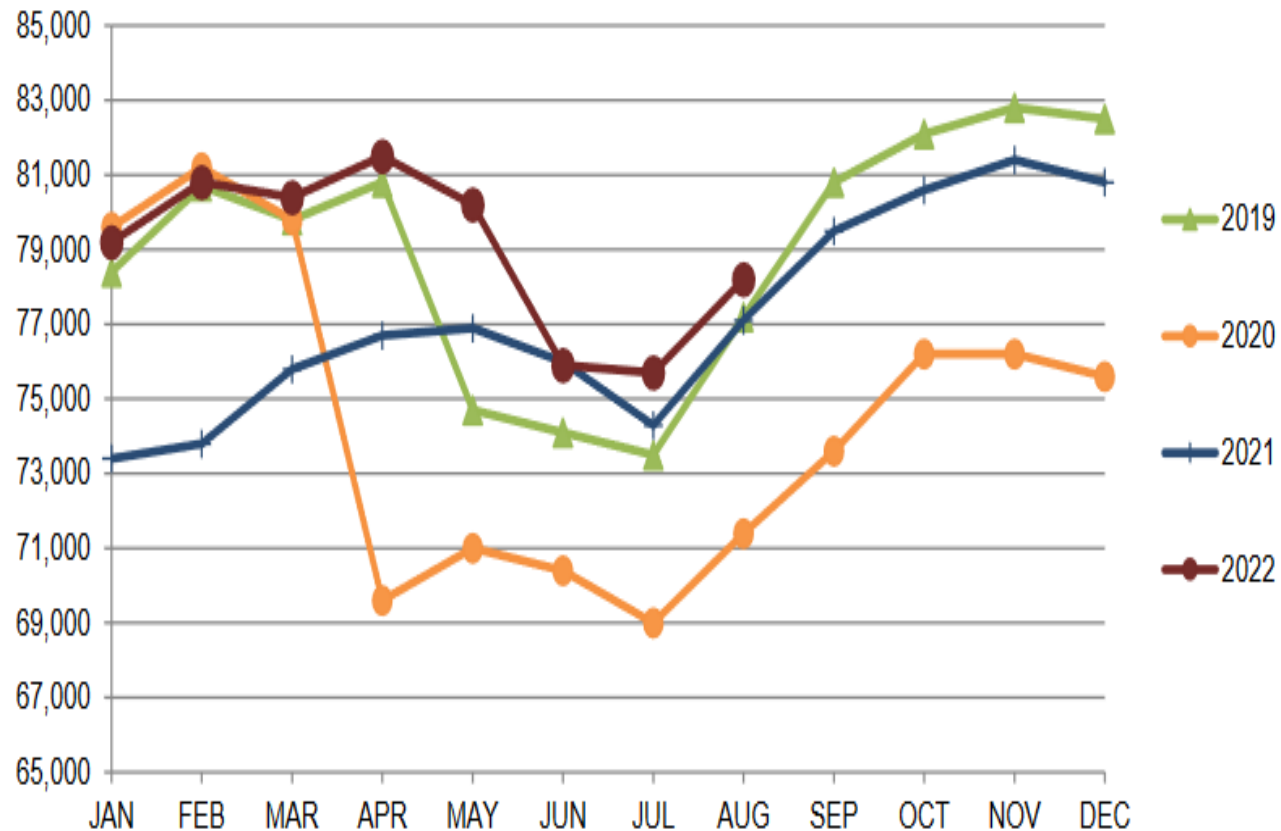
